GAME: I have to admit that the 2.15pm kick off caught me out and I arrived 5 minutes into the game to find the home side lining up a penalty attempt. It came to nothing. I eventually got pitch side and watched as Vale continued to come at us with all guns blazing. I curious sense of déjà vu came over me. They were using same method as I'd seen on so many previous trips to the pretty Lancaster ground. Pick up and go through the forwards until your nose bleeds. Their initial onslaught was very effective. It put us on the back foot and done right it is difficult to defend. After 10 minutes Vale opened the scoring. All the battering created an opening for their centre and he cut a clean line to score to the left of the posts. If the No.10 had known how barren the remaining 70 minutes of the game would be for the home side he may have taken a little more trouble in

making sure that the ball was tee'd up properly for the conversion. Unfortunately the ball toppled over and his kicking time was up. 5-0.

Vale's forward bombardment continued for another five minutes but I sensed that it was sapping the life out of them and it was starting to fizzle out. Their house of cards started to crumble in the 18th minute. It was the first visit to the home side's 22 and it came as Richard Hopkinson lead a counter attacked up the right touch line. When he was stopped the ball was quickly recycled and came to Tim Oakes in the centre. Tim was hit by a tackler but kept his feet and the ball and managed to off load to James Dalton. Dalton to Newton and his well timed pass gave Peter Bredenkamp a clear run to the line like a true winger. It was to prove a good day with the boot for Hoppo and he opened his account with this conversion 5-7.

Wingers seem to be coming in all shapes and sizes these days. Next to try his luck down the left wing was Andy Fuller. He off loaded to John Wilson but John's return pass back to the left went to ground and the chance was gone.

Vale were now having trouble even getting out of their own half and when they did it invariably meant use of the boot and Stockport collected and ran it back. One very notable run came from Hoppo who collected a lovely



inside ball from Craig Cooper around the half way line. His run was stopped inches from the line and he was then judged to have held on in the tackle.

Stockport's next try had an element of good fortune. A nice ball carry by Andy fuller up the right. Recycled twice and Si Baker's pass from the 2nd ruck managed to miss all 5 of the players outside him. James Dalton stuck out a toe and delicately nudged the ball into the left corner and was first there to touch it down. No conversion this time 5-12.

The restart had an element of farce, as the long kick was allowed to bounce and three players entered into the Lancaster heats of 'Mr Polite'. I'm not sure who won it a Vale player who had had to run 30+ yards still got to the loose ball first. It came to nothing as Vale's forwards were visibly tiring from their first half efforts. No further scoring in the half. 5-12.

Our best chances were created when returning their kicks, mainly led by Gareth Matthews, who had a fine game at full back. 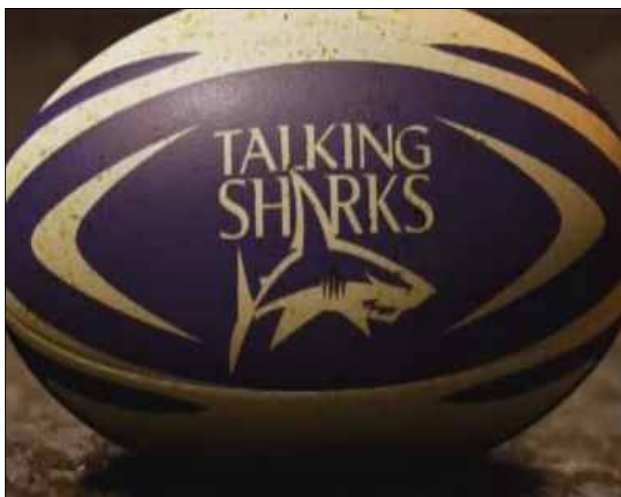
