THE MATCH: It was dull overcast afternoon with a real winter chill in the air. We started really quickly and in no time had created two good opportunities which unfortunately came to nought. Lymm got to see a bit of the ball over the next ten minutes but they only had fleeting visits to the Stockport half. Further Stockport pressure produced a penalty which Hoppo dispatched. 10-0.

Four minutes later one of the Lymm props was quietly amusing himself by trying to bull-doze his way into the side of a maul. The referee decided he needed 10 minutes study time on the laws of the game and produced his yellow card.

We had an attacking line-out but it didn't go to plan and Lymm were awarded a scrum. Chris Weeks then poached their put in. The old adage is that there is nothing quite as good as turn over ball. Chris Nel was about to

prove how true that is. Peter Bredenkamp picked up and passed to Mike Raven. Raven onto Nel who attacked the gap between fly half and centre. He was through in a flash and under the posts. 2 more points from Hoppo. 17-0.

Lymm were the next to come up with an attack as they chipped into our 22. The ball got away from Steve Pearson when he went down on it and Hoppo couldn't believe his luck when the next Lymm poke at the ball sent it straight into his arms. Lymm weren't done with us yet and after 4 minutes of attacking our line they had to settle for a penalty. 17-3.

Stockport's next try had me fooled. I could have sworn that Richard Hopkinson had scored but he and Ian Kennedy both assured me that it was Ian's touch down and had nothing to do with their phone to Spike Milligan in the South of France on Saturday morning during which Burger



promised that he'd get a try in the afternoon. Having reviewed the footage and hearing some Bramhall gossip I can now reveal the reason for my error. A reliable source informed me that on Wednesday she saw Hoppo and Ian leaving a 'Gentleman's' hair salon in Bramhall together and it was clear that they were comparing their identical hair cuts! 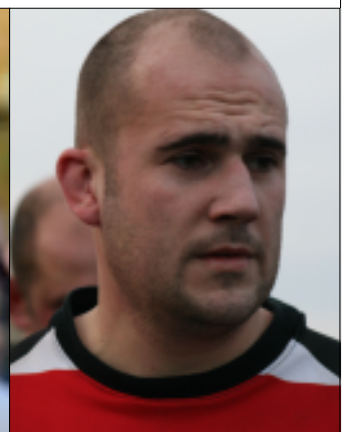

It was touch and go whether we'd see the big man again as we were moving towards the 10 minutes to go mark.

In his absence Lymm broke our defence for the last time with a well engineered try from their full back who ran a good angle to cut through the gap between centre and wing to score. With the conversion the margin was down to 10 points 25-15.

Well Craig Cooper must have thought that anything you can do I can do etc. Pleasingly, following Lymm's second try we actually came out of our 2nd half shell. We mounted some meaningful forays to the Lymm line. Advantage was being played after a driving maul had been pulled down... Stockport Bulldogs 14 v 10 Marple 3rd XV

Call me a cynic or what but I just never expected this result. Let's face it the Bulldogs may have come close a couple of times but they have yet to win in the cup since the leagues were inaugurated. Further they haven't beaten Marple 3's in absolute ages albeit never losing by more than a single score. And finally only five of the previous weeks starting fifteen took to the field. I had been thinking how to work a variation of an old joke into the report. Q. What's the difference between the Bulldogs and a tea bag? A. A tea bag stays in the cup longer. But no I must eat humble pie for the blend of experience, novices and colts turned on one of the best Bulldog performances for some time. It is therefore a real pleasure to write about such a stirring performance in a match that was fought out in the very best spirit of the game by two very even old adversaries.

Learning the lesson from last week the Bulldogs played down the slope but in to the teeth of a stiff wind in the first half. From the onset both sets of forwards smashed into each other but neither budged resulting in an intense midfield battle. It was fully twenty minutes before the 22 line was broken. Marple's fly half deftly chipped the ball over the Bulldog back line and the winger gathered. Up to the plate stepped full back Alex Flitcroft who made a bone shuddering tackle on the supporting number 8. Such was the impact Flitty was forced to leave the field to recover but at least he later had the port moment as just reward. The Bulldogs cleared their line but conceded a penalty from the ensuing lineout that was converted. Having sniffed the line once Marple came back strongly looking for more but were thwarted by the most resolute of Bulldog defences and their own over eagerness to make the killer pass. Twice absolute gilt edged chances went begging with the line at their mercy with a pass to ground and a dire knock-on that would normally have walked the Bulldogs Dick-of-the-Day. Twice they missed the posts when gaining a penalty for a Bulldog minor indiscretion.

Don't get me wrong this was not one way traffic as territorial honours were even in the first half as were the spurned gilt edge chances. The flying Brian Quinn the victim of a pass to his feet with the line firmly in his sights and from a rolling maul Bill Wilson was grounded within a gnats of the line (note to the ground staff – please paint the lines thicker). Come half time the game was there for the taking and a stirring team talk and tactical substitutions saw the Bulldogs take the game by the scruff of the proverbial neck. Both sides went close before a ferocious passage of driving Bulldog forward play linked to thrilling handing in the backs saw the visitors conceded a pressure penalty ten metres out. Boz took a quick tap and bludgeoned his way over at the third attempt to leave the outstanding Ric Morgan the simplest of conversions.

Marple heads sank and from the kick off Man-of-the-Match Mark Dunnington charged forward and held the ball after an awesome bit of juggling. His jinking run got him to within ten metres of the line before he was dumped to the ground. The Bulldogs recycled quickly but chose the blind route with an open overlap at their mercy. Only a last ditch tackle, however prevented the score and Marple cleared. Five minutes later they themselves were robbed when the winger slipped clear but in side stepping the cover tackle brushed the corner flag as he tried to make the posts. Back came the Bulldogs and from another rousing passage of play drove to the line. Young Shaun Roe surprised everyone, belying his youth, as he rolled off the side of the maul and over the line near the posts. Morgan calmly slotting home the extra two points. The final ten minutes were frantic as the visitors pinned the home side in defence seeking a victory. All they managed was a well earned consolation score that did the scoreline justice but the Bulldog defence stood firm in the dying minutes to record an historic victory. And yes I still don't believe it but the league website clearly records the result (OK I did text it in) and a home draw in the next round against unbeaten Oldham 3's.
