Hoppo carried the ball away from danger and it was recycled to the blind t Colin Cooper. Unfortunately he was well tackled and the referee judged that he had not released the ball again and it was the third penalty in the 24 minutes of the game and home side now had a lead of 0-9.

After this the game settled down for a time into a bit of a midfield meleé. Both sides were having trouble stringing any kind of possession together. We saw a lot of unforced errors and we seemed to be going nowhere fast. Then suddenly in the 32nd minute this was finally brought to an end by our best moments of the game. It all started with a 10 yard carry by Richard Hopkinson. At the end after 6 runs by different players and 8 passes Peter Bredenkamp found himself on the wing with clear air in front of himself. Peter backed himself and charged for the line. He only had the full back to beat and he managed to retain sufficient momentum to knock the 15 backwards and allowed him to plat the ball right on the line. With the wind in his face the conversion was difficult but not impossible. Hoppo took his time lining it up and struck it well but the ball just drifted past the left upright. 5-9

Stockport Bulldogs 22 v 22 Village Spartans 1st XV

The Bulldogs were made to work damn hard to stretch their unbeaten run to six games by a well drilled Spartans side on Saturday. In fact by half time the visitors were ten points to the good and looking every bit the team that sits in a clear third place in the league. But as we have said so often in this column the Bulldogs are made of stern stuff and once again they showed their true mettle. As ever in this league there are no easy games and the opening period saw honours even before the visitors mounted their first serious passage of play when good ball was used effectively by the backs. Three recycles and only a last ditch hack into touch robbed them of the opening score. No matter for from the ensuing lineout a well executed back row move broke the first line of defence and was immediately followed by a three quarter move straight off the training ground that sliced open the Bulldog defence and young James Kean made the ten metres to the posts unchallenged. Mercifully the fly half sliced the conversion wide.

The mid spell of the half saw the Spartans backs in the ascendancy. Even in this league first teams train and play together and clearly the coach imported from Sale has had a huge impact transforming last seasons Spartans. At fifteen nil down it looked to be game over but the Bulldogs at last shook off the Christmas excesses and began to get their driving forward play into top gear. Ten minutes of continually pounding the visitors defence finally took it's toll when number 8 Andy Russell drove off the side of a rolling maul that had ground forward some fifteen metres to crash over.

From the first play of the second half tragedy struck when the rejuvenated Bill Wilson retired with a rib injury. A quick reshuffle proved temporary as Mark Baxendall was co-opted from the touchline as emergency prop. Normally this would be a simple 'Port' moment but no it was Dick-of-the-Day for in his haste to grab any kit Mark omitted to check everything. Later he remarked how slippery the pitch was for he could get no grip from his boots. A quick inspection showed he had donned a pair with no studs!! Tactical use of substitutes also played a part and the Bulldogs closed the gap when Ben Gordon charged over from a tap penalty. Game on and for fully ten minutes the Bulldogs had the visitors by the scruff of the neck (I nearly wrote 'short and curlies' but this would be inappropriate given the opposition) and were camped in their 22. Then came what was potentially a pivotal moment. Dave Moore was deemed held up in goal and the visitors won the put in only for the clearance kick to be miscued. A vicious bounce went their way and two plays later it was 22 v 10 and the Spartans looked to be cruising (sorry another terrible pun).

But once again the Bulldog forwards really ground down their opponents. From a lineout on the 22 they gathered and drove forward, rolling off twice before Ben Gordon broke clear, committed the defender and slipped the ball to Mike Whetter who beat the final defender to the corner. Bulldogs never lie down and back again they came in search of more. First young Steve Hindle making his debut had a great run before being outdone by an even better one by George Baxendall. Both proved too fast for the support players and the opportunities fizzled out. So again the forwards took up the cudgels and once more ground out the hard yards only this time it was Mark Dunnington who broke clear and touched down near the posts. Calmly George Baxendall slotted home the match tying kick with ten minutes to go. In the final period both sides went close to snatching victory but final tackles (including Hugh Crosbie's blinding 'Port' moment try saver) kept honours even. Special mention to Mo Newton who took Man-of-the-Match on his welcome return from an 8 week injury lay off, Dave Bailey on his debut, James Warrington and Dave Moore for both bringing learning's from the training ground into their games, and finally a big thanks to Neil Raven who stepped in late Friday night to referee and did us proud – even Burge was kept unusually quiet.

So whilst the unbeaten run is stretched the closeness of the games is reflected in the fact the points for tally has yet to reach the ton. P6, W5, D1, L0, F90, A59. Incidentally this run also makes the Bulldogs the fourth most improved team across the entire Miller Homes Leagues – Bloody brilliant.

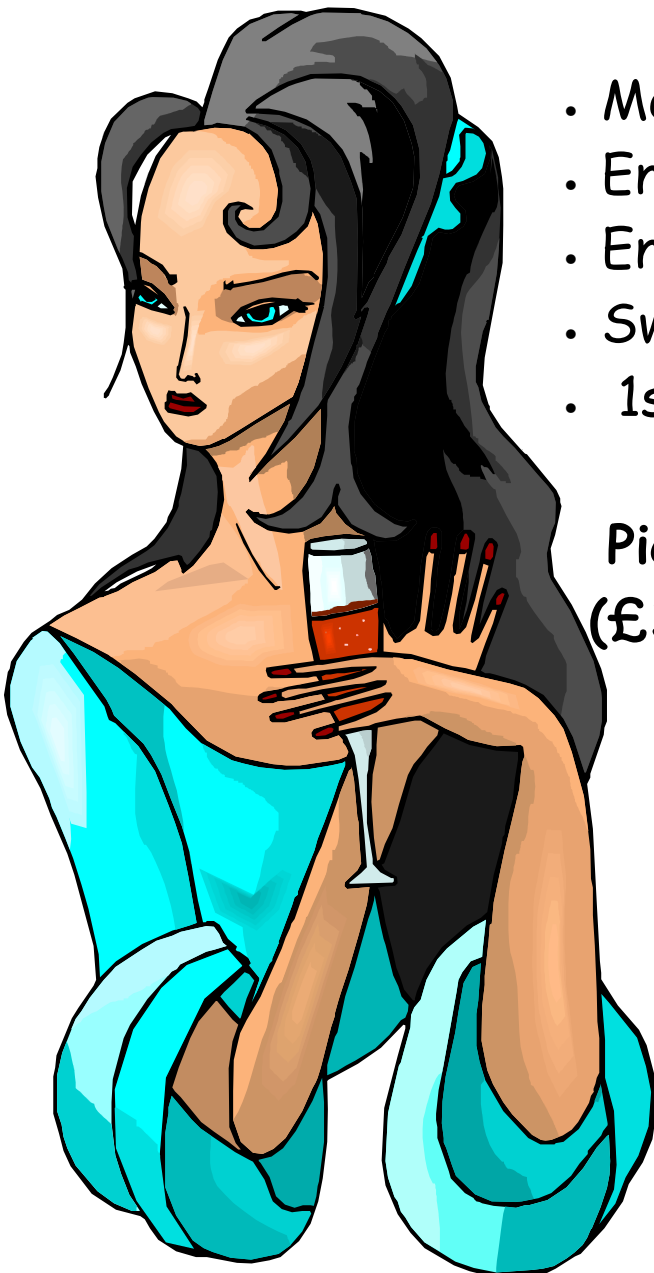
