Oakes was back after illness and Christian Chapman was going to start in place of Hugo Corbett. As it turned out, although he was named in the 19, Hugo never made it to Newport after having to travel to Yorkshire on school business in the morning. Greg Newton tweaked a calf muscle in training on Thursday so Chris Nel would replace him. Steve Pearson would give his injury a rest with a clean shaven Phil Leigh starting at 10.

MATCH REPORT: It was clear from early exchanges that Newport were going to be tricky opposition. They had a Brian Habana look-a-like at 10 and their full back looked full of running and was very elusive. What a didn't know was that they were experimenting with a new hooker and his throwing was a little erratic to say the least. Unfortunately that was not always to our advantage and at an early line out the ball sailed right to the back of the line to their spare player when our back player was busy lifting Peter Brendenkamp.

There was a lot of possession for the home side in the opening minutes but we hadn't been slow out of

the blocks ourselves and we were competing well in the forwards where Newport were happy to concentrate a lot of their efforts Phil Leigh was looking confident at 10 and was showing intelligence with his use of the boot to gain position. In the 12th minute we faced another Newport lineout on our 22. Unfortunately we hadn't learned from the previous line out as again the ball flew high and long and over it's intending target but again it dropped nicely into the hands of their back man. I couldn't believe how much room it left him in and he just set of straight for the try line. Three defenders converged on him but it was too late and he crashed over for the first score of the day and the Newport scrum half added the extras. 0-7.

Our confidence looked unaffected from the restart and we saw a lovely interchange between Craig Cooper and Chris Nel but Craig's little chip through that followed came to nought. Straight from the 22 restart Newport

were penalised for hands in a ruck and Richard Hopkinson stepped for his first kick of the day. It slotted the 3 points from only 7 metres from the left touchline 3-7.

James Drew dropped the ball through his legs at the restart and though not given as a knock on we soon wished it had as when the rucked formed he conceded a penalty. Not surprisingly they elected to go for the 3 points what was surprising was that their No9 missed the attempt narrowly to the right. It had been a let off and we quickly brought play down into Newport territory and we rewarded with another penalty which Hoppo lined up. I say lined up because I not sure in hindsight what exactly he had it lined up on...The short story is that it won't go down as one of Richard's most memorable attempts. The thing was that Kay Weeks as usual got some footage of him lining the kick up and then re-focused the camera up on cross bar and the posts. She was left waiting for the ball to appear in the frame...

The home side were conceded penalties at an even faster rate than we were. Another one and Hoppo's kick brought us to the left hand corner. The catch and drive got over the line but was judged to have been held up. We couldn't make use of the scrum that followed but a short time later the Newport backs were caught offside and Hoppo had a simple kick in front of the posts. 6-7

We were really buzzing now and Andy Fuller was next on the run and again Newport infringed. Two penalties later and Hoppo finally decided to have another pop at the posts. No problem 9-7 and we had our noses in front for the first time.



How long would it last. As it turned out ..not long. Newport came on the attack and their No.10 found a double-decker sized gap in front of him which he promptly drove through. He off loaded and in the tackle by Hoppo on the new ball carrier he managed to loop a pass out to a second row in space on the left wing. We had three defenders heading him off at the corner but when he decide to cut back inside they couldn't react fast enough and he managed to charge over of a crucial score. The conversion followed and we were behind 9-14.

After the restart we defended against 8 phases of possession and still had the opposition in their half. We then forced a penalty for not releasing but it seemed a long way out being just a metre and a half inside the Newport half. Hoppo didn't hesitate and called for the kicking tee. It was a magnificent kick. Straight down the middle clearing the cross bar by at least 12 feet. 12-14.

Half time followed soon after but not before we were lucky not to concede another penalty. We had a Newport forward to thank as his errant foot-work caused the referee to reverse his decision.

We made a bright start to the second half keeping to ball alive with some good handling. We had a try opportunity but some uncharacteristic butter fingers in the backs let it slip away. After 6 minutes we even got yet

another penalty. Hoppo's boot back put us back in front. 15-14. We had been in the driving seat for all the 2nd half to this point and for another 7 minutes as well then suddenly things turned.

The referee awarded a penalty against us for deliberately wheeling a scrum on the half way line. Newport's kick to touch put them in catch and drive territory. We held their drive well but the referee decided that we'd tried to bring the maul down so when the ball was held up over the line we came back for the penalty and Newport elected to scrum it. At the first scrum it is clear that Andy Fuller loses his binding and the scrum has to be reset. The referee then came round to his side of the scrum. The 2nd scrum saw the front row pop us so the scrum was set again. At no point was Andy warned about anything by the referee. At this moment on the sound of the match video I could hear myself say.. "This is the pivotal moment of the game"...me and my big mouth. In the video you can see Andy hit straight and true and this time it's the Newport prop who just gives way onto his knees. Instantly the referee indicates a Newport penalty and moments later Andy is

heading to the sin bin for 10 minutes. Andy was puzzled, we were puzzled and I believe the referee's assessor was pretty puzzled too.

We had to sacrifice Christian Chapman to bring on Dave Morris, who went straight into the firing line, as Newport elected to scrum yet again. At the fourth time of asking Newport managed to get clean ball. The number 8 picked up and went open. Hoppo was acting as flanker and started the process of slowing the big No.8 down but he just managed to reach out and plant the ball over the line. With the conversion we now trailed 15-21 with 25 minutes to down and 9 of those would be without Andy Fuller and down to 14 men.

Hoppo had a chance straight after the restart to narrow the gap but his penalty went just past the left upright. We resumed our domination of the half and witnessed a catalogue of Newport penalty until the referee finally lost patience and yellow carded one of their 2nd rows off. In the same breath Andy Fuller and Christian Chapman were back on and it was Stockport who were now a man up. Hoppo drove deep into the corner. We couldn't get over this time but a few minutes later we were in a good attacking position and had a set scrum. It was a well worked scrum with Mike raven running blind. Peter Bredenkamp picked up and popped to John Wilson coming round from the blindside. John Drove to the line and we formed a maul. Then it turned to the left and over went Tony Shore to score. 20-21 with the kick to follow. I had a feeling that the game would be decided by the kick. There were less than 10 minutes left. Hoppo stepped up and appeared



strike it well and for a moment I thought he'd nailed it, but the ball apparently drifted inched past the post and we were left chasing a one point game.

And chase it did. After a very short time in our 22 we were back on the attack. We pushed and probed and ran till we dropped. Did I say dropped and Hoppo did have an attempt at a drop goal but the ball went left. It perhaps was just a little early. The game still over 2 minutes to run and it let Newport off the hook. We never got back in their half and the final phase of play ended when they knocked on. On reflection after seeing the game again and definitely on the balance of the 2nd half I think we deserved to win. My man of the match was Andy Fuller. He scrumaged well, carried well and gave the forwards a sense of direction so desperately lacking the previous week.

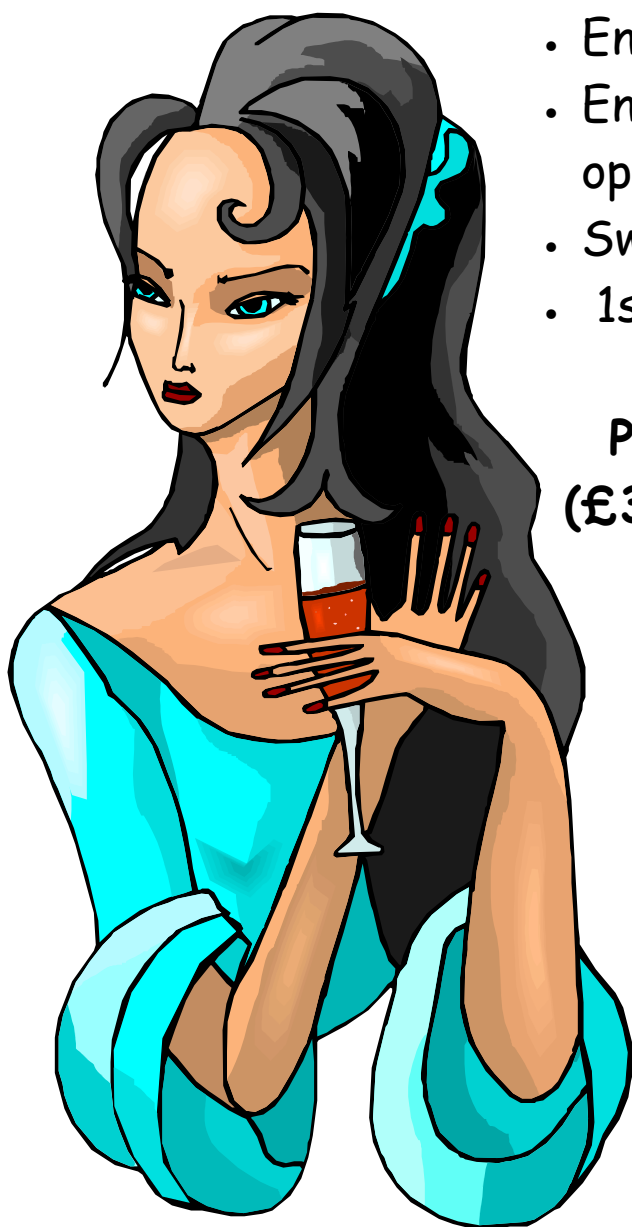
