## STOCKPORT UNDER19'S V BIRKENHEAD PARK U19'S WON 54-0

We had waited for some time to see if the lads could round off their league season with a final win. We never thought that we'd still be playing in the league come the 9th march but Birkenhead Park dully turned up albeit one short for the game.
