with it standing at 29-0.

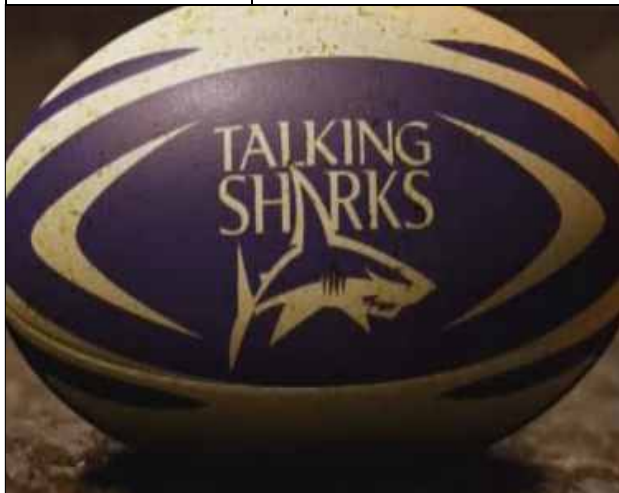

Malcom Milligam, un roc anglais au cœur d'Arques

Cet Anglais passionné de XV vit désormais en terre d'Aude. Son cœur, toutefois, bat pour l'Angleterre.

Malcom Milligam, Anglais pure souche et bon teint, s'est installé dans la Haute-Vallée de l'Aude avec toute sa famille il y a six ans. Il est même grand-père d'un petit Louis, né à Carcassonne en 2005.

Pendant de longues années, il a vécu à Londres où il a dirigé de nombreuses équipes, certains de ses joueurs ayant même orchestré au sein des "moins de 21 ans" des fameux London Wasps. Il a eu à sa charge une équipe "moins de 19 ans" qui peut se targuer d'avoir dominé des clubs huppés, notamment Leicester, Bath ou Northampton. Certains de ces "moins de 19 ans" ont même porté le maillot de la sélection nationale frappé de la rose. Malcom n'en est pas peu fier. Ce passionné du rugby a dirigé cette équipe pendant plus de dix ans.

"Que le meilleur gagne"

A quelques heures de la demi-finale de la Coupe du monde, son pronostic est très indécis : "Il est très difficile de se prononcer. Les deux formations ont réalisé un parcours plus beau que prévu, mais toutes les deux mériteraient de jouer la finale car elles ont sauvé l'honneur de l'hémisphère nord face à la domination attendue du Sud. Personnellement, je souhaite bien évidemment voir l'Angleterre en finale, contre l'Afrique du Sud, pour effacer l'humiliation du match de poule. Mais si la France l'emporte, je deviendrais son premier supporter pour qu'elle soulève le trophée tant convoité. Je dois reconnaître que l'équipe de Bernard Laporte est très équilibrée, animée d'un grand esprit collectif et de sacrifice. Son jeu est certainement le plus passionnant du monde à re-

garder. Mes compatriotes, eux, ont une grande force, le "cinq" de devant. Leur troisième ligne est également un "joyau de la couronne". La faiblesse des Anglais se situe au niveau des centres où les Français peuvent faire la différence. Que le meilleur gagne sera le leitmotiv, ma principale satisfaction étant, quel que soit le résultat final, que l'esprit propre à notre cher rugby permette aux deux équipes de se respecter et se congratuler".

Malcom Milligam avoue avoir apprécié le tournoi dans son ensemble, qui est une remarquable vitrine pour le rugby international, et plus particulièrement les équipes en devenir. "Pourquoi ne pas envisager une finale USA - Italie dans les futures éditions? Cela serait une vraie reconnaissance de la mondialisation de la planète ovale."

Pour prouver son attachement à la région et au rugby français, Malcom avait fait signer à Limoux, voici trois saisons, Richard Hopkinson qu'il avait dirigé dans son pays en "moins de 21 ans". Aujourd'hui revenu de l'autre côté du Channel, il a fini parmi les trois meilleurs réalisateurs de la 3^e division anglaise avec son club de Stockport, la saison dernière. Mister Milligam l'Audois ne manquerait sous aucun prétexte les rencontres de Limoux XV au stade de l'Aiguille où les "Allez Limoux" qui fusent avec un accent "so british" sont devenus légendaires.

Comme d'habitude, Malcom Milligam et sa famille iront voir le match France - Angleterre chez leur ami Christian Ribéra, au café de France (le bien nommé) à Limoux. Et quel que soit le vainqueur, la bière coulera à flots.
