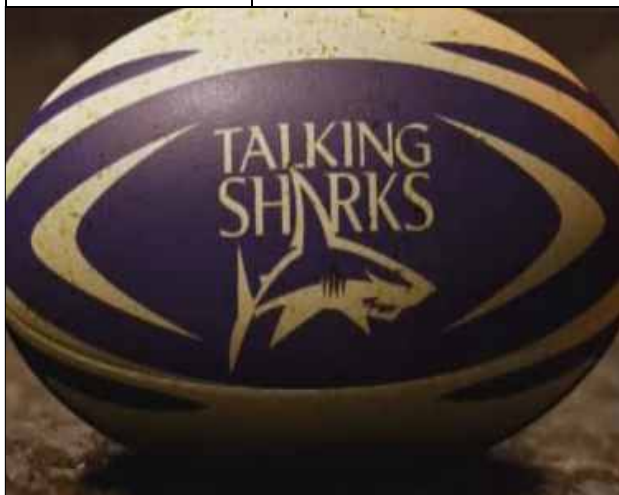
It had been a thoroughly enjoyable afternoon. The game had been played in the best of spirits. Refereed intelligently by
